






Planning Ahead for Year 11 & 12

Accelerated Studies

Students may also choose <u>one</u> **VCE or VET** subject from those available to Year 10 students.

Undertaking a VCE subject in Year 10 is **not recommended** if a student's reports demonstrate that they are below expected standard on the Victorian Curriculum or if the Learning Habits are not 'Excellent' or 'Very Good' across all subjects.

VCE & VET studies are FULL YEAR subjects.

WHAT IS HEAD START?

Head Start is a pathway allowing students to undertake a school-based apprenticeship or traineeship whilst also progressing towards the completion of their Year 12 qualification

- Students can do this through the VCE VM or VCE program
- Time within the workplace and training can increase each year in order to support significant progression through the apprenticeship or traineeship
- Students will be required to attend Tafe/trade school
- Students will receive an individualised program and timetable

The Head Start Coordinator's role is to:

- Identify students and have initial conversations with the student, school and families
- Case manage each participant to ensure they are progressing well
- · Assist students and families to identify suitable employers
- Support all parties involved in the SBAT process
